- Bids will be received by the Carrington Research Extension Center to the attention of Mike Ostlie, 663 Highway 281 North, Carrington, ND 58421 for the construction of the Carrington REC - Livestock Support Facility. On behalf of Craftwell Architects + Construction and the NDSU Research extension Center, until 3:00 P. M., Local Time, on Thursday, Sept 1, 2022, at which time the bids will be publicly opened and read aloud. All bids received after the scheduled time will be returned to the bidder unopened. Bidders shall have the option to submit a Prime Bid for all classifications of the work and/or separate bids for General Construction, Mechanical Construction, and Electrical Construction. The procurement and contracting information including: Drawings, Technical Specifications, Addenda, and other contract documents as prepared by Craftwell Architects + Construction; Heyer Engineering, Structural Engineer; may be examined at the following places: The office of Craftwell Architects + Construction, Fargo, North Dakota, and the builders exchanges of Bismarck, Fargo-Moorhead, Minot, and Grand Forks, North Dakota; Dodge Data & Analytics, and Construction Market Data. The bid security must be in the sum equal to five percent (5%) of the full amount of the bid including any add alternates and must be in the form of a bidder's bond made payable to the Carrington Research Extension Center. A bidder's bond must be executed by the bidder as principal and surety, conditioned that if the principal's bid is accepted and the contract awarded to the principal, the principal, within ten days after notice of the award, shall execute a contract in accordance with the terms of the bid and the bid bond and any condition of the governing body. A countersignature of a bid bond is not required under this section. If a successful bidder does not execute a contract within the ten days allowed, the bidder's bond must be forfeited to the governing body and the project awarded to the next lowest responsible bidder. No bidder may withdraw this bid within 60 days after the actual date of the opening thereof. The bids of the three lowest Bidders for each contract will be retained until the contract has been awarded and executed, but no longer than thirty (30) days after the date of the Bid.

All Bidders shall hold a valid North Dakota Contractor's license of the proper class for the full amount of the bid and shall enclose a copy of the license or Certificate of Renewal of the license with their bid.

The Owner reserves the right to reject any and all bids and to waive any formalities therein and rebid the project until a satisfactory bid is received. The successful Bidder will be required at the time the contract is executed to provide Workers' Compensation Insurance Certificate, Certificate of Insurance, Company Safety Manual, and Waiver of Subrogation.

2022-2023 Chronic Wasting Disease Proclamation Summary

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department declares the following precautions against the spread of Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) into and within North Dakota.
CWD affects the nervous system of white-tailed deer, mule deer, elk, moose, and other cervids and it is always fatal!

Baiting
It is illegal to hunt big game over bait or place bait to attract big game for the purpose of hunting in deer hunting units 1, 2B, 3A1, 3A2, 3A3, 3A4, 3B1, 3C, 3D1, 3D2, 3E1, 3E2, 3F1, 3F2, 4A, 4B, 4C, 4D, 4E and 4F. In addition, it is illegal to hunt big game over bait or place bait on any Department Wildlife Management Areas. Bait includes grain, seed, mineral, salt, fruit, vegetable nut, hay, any naturally derived scent or lure (e.g., urine), or natural or manufactured food placed by an individual. Baiting does not include agricultural practices, gardens, wildlife food plots, agricultural crops, livestock feeds, fruit or vegetables in their natural location such as apples on or under an apple tree, or unharvested food or vegetables in a garden. This ban does not apply to wildlife management activities conducted by or under the direction of the Department.

Carcass Transportation
It is illegal to transport into or within North Dakota the whole carcass or carcass parts of: a) a white-tailed deer, mule deer, moose, elk, or members of the cervid family harvested outside of North Dakota; b) a white-tailed deer or mule deer from deer hunting units 3A1, 3A2, 3B1, 3C, 3D1, 3E2, 3F2, 4B, 4C and 4C in North Dakota; c) a moose from moose hunting units M10 and M11 in North Dakota; and d) an elk from elk hunting unit E2 and E6 in North Dakota; except for the following lower risk portions of the carcass:

- Meat that is cut and wrapped either commercially or privately.
- Quarters or other portions of meat with no part of the spinal column or head attached.
- Meat that has been boned out.
- Hides with no heads attached.
- Clean (no hide or brain tissue present) skull plates with antlers attached.
- Intact skulls with no visible brain or spinal cord tissue present that has the eyes, lower jaw, tongue, salivary glands, tonsils, and lymph nodes removed.
- Antlers separated from skull plate.
- Upper canine teeth, also known as buglers, whistlers, or ivories.
- Finished taxidermy heads.
- Lymph nodes extracted from the head for the purpose of CWD testing that are contained within a sealed, plastic bag.

The entire city limits of a city that shares a border with any of the following hunting units shall be included in that unit: 3A1, 3A2, 3B1, 3C, 3D1, 3E2, 3F2, 4B, 4C, M10, M11, E2 or E6. It is legal to transport moose carcasses between adjoining/adjacent CWD carcass restricted moose units and deer carcasses between adjoining/adjacent CWD carcass restricted deer units.
