ANALYSIS OF THE STATEWIDE MEASURES APPEARING ON THE ELECTION BALLOT JUNE 11, 2024

The following analysis is for the measure appearing on the statewide Primary Election ballot on June 11, 2024. This publication is required by section 16.1-01-07 of the North Dakota Century Code to enable voters to become familiar with the effect of proposed measures. The full text of each measure is available on the Secretary of State's website at vote.nd.gov or by requesting a copy from the Elections Division, Secretary of State's office at (800) 352-0867, ext. 328-4146, or from the office of any County Auditor.

In addition, as required by section 16.1-01-17 of the North Dakota Century Code, a copy of the Legislative Council's report on the estimated fiscal impact of initiated Measures No. 1 is available on the Secretary of State's website at vote.nd.gov, by calling (800) 352-0867, ext. 328-4146, or by writing to Secretary of State, 600 E Boulevard Avenue Dept 108, Bismarck ND 58505-0500.

Analysis of Initiated Constitutional Measure No. 1
Initiated Constitutional Measure No. 1 was placed on the ballot by petitions circulated by a sponsoring committee. If approved, it would add a new article to the North Dakota Constitution. Under the measure, no person may be elected or appointed to serve any portion of a term repre-

sending North Dakota in the U.S. Senate or the U.S. House of Representatives if that person could be 81 years old by December 31 of the year immediately preceding the end of the term, and any such person is prohibited from appearing on the ballot. If a superior law requires age-limited candidates to appear on the ballot in a primary or general election, the candidates' age on December 31 of the year immediately preceding the end of the term they are seeking must be printed next to the names of all candidates for all federal legislative offices in future elections. The article also requires the Attorney General to zealously defend Section 4 of the article in the courts of this state or of the United States. The article would become effective immediately upon approval by the voters. If the measure conflicts with any other provision of the state constitution, the measure states it would prevail over the other constitutional provisions.

The estimated fiscal impact of this measure is \$1,000,000.

Voting "YES" means you approve the measure summarized above. Voting "NO" means you reject the measure summarized above.

Initiated County Measure No. 1
Initiated County Measure No. 1 was placed on the ballot by resolution of the Foster County Board of County Commissioners. Foster County currently levies a total of up to 12 mills for road levies. The current levying authority beyond 10 mills will be expiring and a majority vote is required to increase the levy up to twenty-five mills for Road & Bridge. Should the Foster County Board of Commissioners have the authority to levy up to 25 mills in the County Road & Bridge Fund, per NDCC Chapter 57-15-06.7(5)?

Voting "YES" means you approve the measure as summarized above. Voting "NO" means you reject the measure summarized above.

Meeting called to order at

6:00pm.
Minutes were read and approved as read, 1st by Vic and 2nd by Dennis.

Bills and Financial report were approved, 1st by Dennis and 2nd by Vic.

Old Business: Brad Tweed and Troy Hafner were here to represent the Fire Department. Brad presented a proposal that the Fire Department would take over the responsibilities dealing with the Fire/City Hall. The City would still be responsible for supplying the water and garbage services and paying half of the DCT bill. The City Auditor's office would remain as is and would still hold City Meetings in the office. The proposal will be discussed with the two boards and a decision will be decided at a later meeting.

New Business: Brad and Troy brought up that the Weather Siren by this building has been maintained by the Fire Department. The City was asked if the back up batteries needed to be replaced, if the City would help pay for them. Motion was made to pay for the replacement batteries if needed; 1st by Dennis and 2nd by Vic.

Troy Hafner asked if his services would be required this year for sweeping the boulevards for rock. Yes the City would like to hire him to sweep. It was discussed about when he should start doing the sweeping and where he might have to make more than one pass.

Richard Hatch asked if any gravel would be hauled in for the roads and alleyways. Gravel may be hauled in for the roads but as for the alleyways, that probably would not be done any time soon.

The Mayor asked Brad if during one of their training nights if the Fire Department would be able to flush the storm drain. It will be discussed at the Fire Department meeting.

The antenna mounted on the water plant has been having some reception issues. The Water Tower has not been getting good reception at times. It was suggested moving the antenna to the South

side of the building so it is facing the cell tower that is South of Sykeston. Brad Tweed was asked to look into the issue and he said he would.

The invoice from H&H Coating dealing with the maintenance that was done on the Water Tower was discussed. Motion was made to pay the bill, 1st by Vic and 2nd by Dennis.

The Mayor brought up an upcoming training on fire hydrants on April 4th, 2024 in Bismarck. Vic and Rick both said they are interested in going. The training would include how to take the hydrants apart and then how to repair them.

The Park Board and the City Council will be having positions up for election this year. Park Board will have 1(one) four (4) year term and the City will have 1(one) two(2) year term and 1(one) four(4) year term. The form SFN 02704 needs to be filled out and turn in by 5:00 pm, April 5th, 2024 to the City Auditor, Kathy Lesmeister. The form can be found on-line or in the Post Office by the notice or by contacting the City Auditor.

The Property Tax Assessment meeting will be held on April 9th, 2024 at the City/Fire Hall; the same night as the City Council Meeting. A notice will be posted in the Post Office.

Meeting adjourned at 7:00 pm.
