Why do we publish insurance abstracts?

Because the N.D. Century Code says so.

26.1-03-10. Publication of abstract of annual statement and certificate of authority.

An insurance company, at the time it submits its annual statement for filing, shall submit an abstract of the annual statement for publication upon the form prescribed by the commissioner. The abstract of the annual statement of each company, other than a state or county mutual insurance company, must be published at least three times in one newspaper of general circulation, designated by the commissioner, printed and published by each judicial district in this state in which the company has an agency. The abstract of the annual statement of each state or county mutual insurance company, must be published once in a newspaper published in the county in which the company has its principal place of business, the newspaper designated by the members of the company at their annual meeting. The certificate of authority issued by the commissioner to authorize the company to do business within the state must be published in connection with the publication of the abstract of its annual statement. The fees for publication are those provided under section 46-05-03. Proof of publication must be filed with the commissioner within four months after the filing of the annual statement.

ANALYSIS OF THE STATEWIDE MEASURES APPEARING ON THE ELECTION BALLOT JUNE 11, 2024

The following analysis is for the measure appearing on the statewide Primary Election ballot on June 11, 2024. This publication is required by section 16.1-01-07 of the North Dakota Century Code to enable voters to become familiar with the effect of proposed measures. The full text of each measure is available on the Secretary of State's website at vote.nd.gov or by requesting a copy from the Elections Division, Secretary of State's office at (800) 352-0867, ext. 328-4146, or from the office of any County Auditor.

In addition, as required by section 16.1-01-17 of the North Dakota Century Code, a copy of the Legislative Council's report on the estimated fiscal impact of initiated Measures No. 1 is available on the Secretary of State's website at vote.nd.gov, by calling (800) 352-0867, ext. 328-4146, or by writing to Secretary of State, 600 E Boulevard Avenue Dept 108, Bismarck ND 58505-0500.

Analysis of Initiated Constitutional Measure No. 1
Initiated Constitutional Measure No. 1 was placed on the ballot by petitions circulated by a sponsoring committee. If approved, it would add a new article to the North Dakota Constitution. Under the measure, no person may be elected or appointed to

serve any portion of a term representing North Dakota in the U.S. Senate or the U.S. House of Representatives if that person could be 81 years old by December 31 of the year immediately preceding the end of the term, and any such person is prohibited from appearing on the ballot. If a superior law requires age-limited candidates to appear on the ballot in a primary or general election, the candidates' age on December 31 of the year immediately preceding the end of the term they are seeking must be printed next to the names of all candidates for all federal legislative offices in future elections. The article also requires the Attorney General to zealously defend Section 4 of the article in the courts of this state or of the United States. The article would become effective immediately upon approval by the voters. If the measure conflicts with any other provision of the state constitution, the measure states it would prevail over the other constitutional provisions.

The estimated fiscal impact of this measure is \$1,000,000.

Voting "YES" means you approve the measure summarized above. Voting "NO" means you reject the measure summarized above.

Initiated County Measure No. 1
Initiated County Measure No. 1 was placed on the ballot by resolution of the Foster County Board of County Commissioners. Foster County currently levies a total of up to 12 mills for road levies. The current levying authority beyond 10 mills will be expiring and a majority vote is required to increase the levy up to twenty-five mills for Road & Bridge. Should the Foster County Board of Commissioners have the authority to levy up to 25 mills in the County Road & Bridge Fund, per NDCC Chapter 57-15-06.7(5)?

Voting "YES" means you approve the measure as summarized above. Voting "NO" means you reject the measure summarized above.

DEER GUN	November 8 12:00 noon (CT) 16 1/2 Day Season	November 24	All units	Restricted to type of deer and unit described on license. Type of deer includes species and whether antlerless or antlered (at least one visible antler). Note exception for white-tailed deer hunters in units 4B, 4D and 4E. Orange clothing required.
MUZZLELOADER	November 29 12:00 noon (CT)	December 15	Statewide	Restricted to white-tailed deer only and type of deer described on license. No unit restrictions. Orange clothing required.
YOUTH DEER	September 13 12:00 noon (CT)	September 22	Statewide	11 (by Dec. 31), 12, & 13 year olds - Antlerless white-tailed deer only. 14 (by Dec. 31) & 15 year olds - Any deer is legal. In units 3B1, 3B2, 4A, 4B, 4C, 4D, 4E and 4F a special license is required to hunt antlered mule deer. No unit restrictions except those possessing the special antlered mule deer license must hunt in their unit the entire season. Orange clothing required.

Commercial trade waste will not be accepted free of charge at the city's landfill, i.e., water heaters, refrigerators, furnaces, construction debris, etc. However, **commercial trade waste will be accepted** at the city's landfill for a fee.

All loads containing loose material must be tarped with end gates or subject to a fine three times the load rate. All loads containing nails require sideboards and end gates.

The City of Carrington will be providing dumpsters at the water tower site for branches, leaves and grass clippings again this year. ABSOLUTELY no other materials accepted or allowed at this site. Please separate grass/leaves from bags and deposit in the appropriate dumpsters as marked. Thank You!
