At 1:30pm, Chairman Utke called the Foster County Commission meeting to order. Roll call included Commissioner Scott Beumer, Commissioner Becky Hagel, Commissioner David Utke, Commissioner Alan Scanson, and

Commissioner Pat Copenhaver. Also present was Foster County Auditor/Treasurer Ellen Roundy. The meeting began with ap-

proval of the minutes for the July

cation. Commissioner Scanson motioned to approve the minutes with the change, seconded by Commissioner Copenhaver, All voted ave and the motion passed.

Rain totaled 4.66" for the month of July The Club Hall Road project will be bushed back from the original start of August to October. The department still has barricades out at Bordulac for the Train derailment and all highway ditches were mowed by the department or landowners. Jeff Bata will no longer serve on the Weed Board and Monson presented Elliot Paczkowski as his replacement. Commissioner Beumer motioned to approve Paczkowski to the Weed Board, seconded by Commissioner Copenhaver, all voted ave, and the motion passed. Auditor/Treasurer Roundy completed the Oath of Office with Paczkowski.

Auditor/Treasurer Roundy presented the preliminary budget to the BOCC for approval. Commissioner Scanson motioned to approve the preliminary budget as presented seconded by Commissioner Hagel. All voted ave and the motion passed. Roundy presented the pledge of assets to the BOCC. Commissioner Scanson motioned to approve the pledge of assets. seconded by Commissioner Hagel. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Tax Director, Karen Evans. presented the BOCC with one abatement for Laural Leif Holtan for the years 2022 and 2023. Commissioner Copenhaver motioned to approve the abatement, seconded by Commissioner Scanson. All voted ave and the motion passed Foster County Planning and Zoning held a meeting at 7:00 AM on August 6th for building permits. The building permits are for Darin Hoff, pole barn, Cameron and Ellen Roundy, new build, and Jason Sisson, pole barn. Commissioner Beumer motioned to approve the building permits seconded by Commissioner Copenhaver, All voted ave and the motion passed. A public hearing was held at 7:15 AM for a conditional use permit for American Towner/Verizon equipment modifications at existing telecommunications site in Haven Township. Commissioner Copenhaver motioned to approve the conditional use permit seconded by Commissioner Scanson. All voted ave and the motion passed. Evans noted that the state has a grant opportunity for reimbursement on cost of posting information with Vanguard's website. She has applied for the grant and will keep the BOCC updated. Also discussed was address changes and working with her department and the BOCC on creating steps for the process.

Nick Delaney, with Rinke Noonan, joined the meeting via teams to discuss the guick take action process with easements and the Foster County Water Resource District. The quick take procedure is as follows: 1. Conduct informal negotiations for not less than sixty days

2. Engage in formal negotia-

tions by sending an appraisal and written offer for just compensation by certified mail 3. If there is no response for 15 days, send a written request for a

meeting by certified mail 4. If there is no response to the meeting request for 30 days, send

written notice of intent to take the easement by certified mail. 5. If there is no response to this notice, the District must request

approval from the County Commissioners to utilize the quick take 6. The Commissioners must give at least 30 days' advance

notice to the landowners prior to the public meeting. 7. The Commissioners shall

and vote on authority to use the quick take procedures, during which the Commissioners shall verify that the District made no reference or threat of quick take eminent domain during negotiations.

Upon a Commissioner vote approving quick take by the District the District may take immediate possession of right-of-way, but not a blanket easement, by filling an affidavit of the District Chairman that the above procedures have been followed and the appraisal amount for the easement has been depos ited with the district court; and

9. The landowner has the opportunity to appeal to the district court within 30 days, which begins an eminent domain proceeding under NDCC Title 32-15. The public meeting has been

scheduled for August 20th at 3:30 PM at the Foster County Courthouse. The BOCC was unaware that construction on the Drain was going to begin on August 12th. Jennifer Malloy, APEX Engineering provided an update on signage and communication contacts for the Road Department during that Michael Gussiaas, Foster

County Resident, approached the BOCC regarding the Drain #1 project. Discussion included assessment amount and the quick take process. Commissioner Utke noted that the BOCC must decide if the FCWRD followed the correct Commissioner Utke and Com-

Monson also provided a mowing notice to be placed in the Foster County Independent. Commissioner Copenhaver motioned to approve the ad seconded by Commissioner Hagel. All voted ave and the motion passed.

Ellen Roundy, Auditor/Treasurer provided an update for the basement renovation project. They will be completed with sheetrock ing by the end of the week and will start to tape and mud the following week. Rough in work for electrical and HVAC has started in phase two, and they are on schedule for overall work progress. Commissioner Utke presented

information on the Club Hall Road A petition had circulated by residents in Foster County and residents outside of Foster County to revert the BOCC's decision to grind the Club Hall Road. Discussion included the cost of maintaining the current road. The county has spent over \$123,000 in the last year and half to patch spots on the road that do not provide a long-term solution. The Road Department spends one to two days a week working on spots, and it cannot be sustained The county's engineering firm has completed studies on all of Foster County's roads. The Club Hall road's current condition does not allow for an overlay to happen. The options are to continue to patch the road, but that does not fix the problem, it only delays the actua repair of the road, grind the road or to completely rebuild the road The estimated cost to rebuild the road is anticipated to be over six million dollars. The county has submitted a grant for work to be completed but was not awarded money. The same grant may not be available every year and there is no guarantee that Foster County would be awarded money for any specific road or project submitted with any grant that is applied to Commissioner Utke provided information on total miles per township with counties that surround Foster. Foster is the highest by almost a mile. The BOCC is in agreeance that this is something they do not want to do, however, they do not feel like they are being responsible with taxpayer dollars to continue to inject money into a road that needs a complete overhaul. The BOCC wants to continue to maintain all the paved roads the best that they can, and this happens to be the road they needed to start with per direction from the engineering firm Residents' discussion included grant applications, when the traffic count was conducted and holding off on the project or completing part of the project. The BOCC stayed unanimous with their decision to move forward with the grinding of

Commissioner Utke provided an update on the maintenance at Juanita Lake. A dropbox and new door handle has been purchased to help with reservations and entrance into the Quonset. Commissioner Scanson was going to make arrangements for winter storage. The BOCC also agreed to submit payment to Beve Johnson for work that has been completed for mowing and maintenance at Juanita Lake. Jeff Bata is moving out of the county and Jeff Edland has agreed to finish out Bata's term on the Foster County Water Board. Commissioner Beumer motioned to appoint Edland to the board, seconded by Commissioner Copenhaver. All voted aye and the motion passed. Discussion also included creating a policy for PPE reimbursements. Auditor/Treasurer Roundy will work on the policy and bring to the BOCC for approval.
